Aquesta commits \$250K to Cain Center

Feb. 12. Aquesta Bank is committing \$250,000 to the Cain Center for the Arts, the \$25 million arts center which will be built on Catawba Avenue across from Town Hall. The community bank was launched in 2006.

The Cain Center vision

<u>Cain Center for the Arts</u> will be a home for creativity, learning, entertainment and community for the Lake Norman region. The center will include a 400-seat theater, gallery space, an outdoor venue, and classrooms. In addition to providing a home for national and regional shows and performances, it will also be a venue for community, private, and civic events.

A \$4 million bond project for redeveloping the arts district in the historic downtown Cornelius, combined with a foundational gift of \$5 million from Bill and Ericka Cain has put the center well on its way towards its \$25 million fundraising goal.
