Every young person deserves the opportunity to experience the arts. Ample evidence proves that participating in the arts affects motivation, attitude, and attendance and leads to success in school, in life, and in work. Arts education is an essential component of the Cain Center's commitment to the community.





A student involved in the arts is four times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement.

Low-income students who are highly engaged in the arts are more than twice as likely to graduate from college as their peers with no arts education.



 Students involved in the arts are three times more likely to be elected to class office.



Low socioeconomic status students with high participation in the arts have a dropout rate of 4 percent, but their peers with low participation in the arts have a dropout rate of 22 percent.



Students with an education rich in the arts have historically earned higher grade point averages and scored higher on the SAT scores on average.



OUR COMMITMENT TO SERVE THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY

Centrally located and easily accessed from the diverse towns and neighborhoods that make up the fourcounty Lake Norman region, the Center will be a resource for nearly 300,000 residents. By 2040 that number is projected to grow to half a million.

For many of these residents, access to the arts is challenging. The distance to urban centers where the arts already thrive is a genuine barrier, as is access to affordable classes, performances, and other experiences.

Access to the arts creates a level playing field, where people of all ages and backgrounds can participate in the joy of creativity, personal expression, and engagement. Making the arts accessible and relevant for everyone is central to the mission of Cain Center for the Arts.

OUR PROJECT:

Cain Center for the Arts is a partnership between the Town of Cornelius and a 501 (c)3 organization led by Executive Director Justin Dionne and a 16-member board of directors. Funded in part by

\$4 million allocated by voters in 2013, the Center will be located on 1.85 acres in the town's emerging arts district.

Our physical venue will be a regional hub for performance, programming, and partnership. It will serve as a place for the community to gather and as a starting point for initiatives that take the arts out into schools, community centers,
